Since 1974, he has published about 150 articles, often on topics of theoretical ecology that had the potential to be subsequently used in applications, focusing on invertebrates and fish in streams and rivers from various parts in Africa, America and Europe. His current research interests are “Effects of physical and sociohistorical factors on contemporary landscape patterns”, “Optimization of search strategies to find more mushrooms”, “Increasing quality and quantity of vegetable production” and “Predicting the outcome of horse races”.
